Goal:

- Award two scholarships to two Syracuse High School seniors who are aspiring educators.

Scholarship Amount and Distribution Schedule:

- If all criteria are met, a total of up to \$2,500/student



Distribution Schedule

\$500	After review and selection <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Proof of registration needs to be sent to the Syracuse High School Counselor by October 1st of freshman year.
\$1,000	During student teaching <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Pending first supervisor review.- The review will need to be sent to the Syracuse High School Counselor for the distribution of this installment.
\$1,000	After earning a bachelor's degree, and a teacher's certificate, at a state-approved institution <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Contact the Syracuse High School Counselor with necessary documentation in order to receive the final installment of the scholarship.

- 2 Letters of Recommendation- ***These letters must be specific to this scholarship.** General letters of recommendation will not be considered.*

Applications are due to the HS Counselor no later than March 18th.

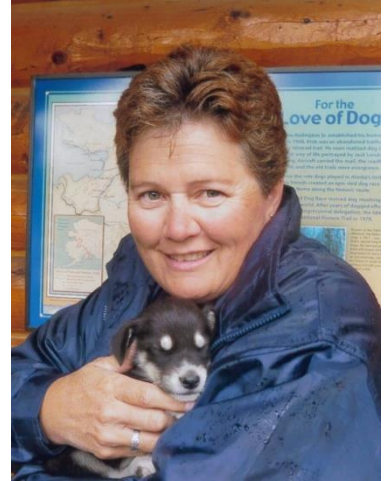
